



US Club Soccer is a non-profit organization committed to the support and development of competitive soccer clubs. It is founded on the belief that soccer clubs, which are in the business of elite player development, need an organization of their own to foster growth, address concerns, and sanction and provide programs with a minimum of rules and restrictions. US Club Soccer has been a National Affiliate member of the United States Soccer Federation (USSF) since 2001, and as such, registers players and sanctions teams, leagues, tournaments and other soccer programs. The National Cup is US Club Soccer's signature national championship competition. In 2010, National Cup IX Regionals for U-11 through U-18/19 boys' and girls' teams were held in 11 cities in advance of the 2010 National Cup IX Finals, where national champions in U-13 through U-17 age groups – in two competitive divisions – were crowned. The 2010 National Cup IX Finals were held in Virginia Beach, Va.



id² – US Club Soccer's national player identification and development program – seek to identify and develop the country's best players for possible inclusion in U.S. Soccer's National Team programs. Qualified players are invited to participate in an id² Training Camp for four days of competition and evaluation through an extensive scouting and recommendation process as they compete in a familiar environment – with their club teams. Any player is able to be recommended (including unaffiliated players), and there is no fee or tryout necessary to be included in the id² program. The current program targets boys born in 1997-98 and includes the id² National Selection International Tour, and girls born in 1994-97.



US Club Soccer's state cups allow hosting members the flexibility to develop an event that is formatted based upon the needs of each specific state or region. Highlights of US Club Soccer's state cups include different levels of competition, flexible roster rules, and a customized schedule and format that are designed in consultation with member clubs.



In addition to administering leagues, US Club Soccer also provides league sanctioning programs. Current member leagues include local and regional competitive and travel leagues, younger-age developmental and in-house leagues as well as adult leagues. US Club Soccer provides a structure for success, but league staff members have the flexibility to make decisions in the best interest of their individual league.



US Club Soccer's tournament sanctioning program allows both US Club Soccer teams and also those registered with other USSF affiliates the ability to participate in competitions. The program enables members to tailor their tournaments to meet their competitive needs. Travel permissions are not required for US Club Soccer members, and tournament insurance is offered for members and non-members.
